#### **Aims of Module**

To demonstrate personal, critical and contextual abilities through self-directed study, formulating research skills and increasing critical awareness of contemporary photographic practice.

### **Learning Outcomes for Module**

On completion of this module, students are expected to be able to:

- Experiment with critical and contextual themes relating to contemporary photographic practice within a broad cultural framework.
- 2 Draw on self-directed critical research themes in relation to personal interests and practice.
- Formulate research skills and methods in relation to a wide cultural framework and self-directed study using appropriate information retrieval methods.
- 4 Demonstrate appropriate methods to document evidence of research activity.

#### **Indicative Module Content**

The module will formulate theoretical core skills essential to underpin the individual student's personal interests and photographic practice. The module is focussed on understanding a range of theories, concepts, cultural forms and processes relating to photography. Students will draw on appropriate information systems to research and submit work. Additionally, methods of visualisation, documentation, research, analysis, referencing and academic writing will be discussed. Completed theoretical project work should demonstrate an awareness of sustainable themes in a photographic context.

The module is seminar based with an increasing emphasis on self-directed study. Tutorial support, both group and individual, will form part of this module.
