Aims of Module

To organise research, critical and communication skills through a personal theoretical framework related to the student's studio practice.

Learning Outcomes for Module

On completion of this module, students are expected to be able to:

- 1 Draw on in-depth, personal critical and contextual themes relating to their photographic and curatorial practice.
- 2 Organise self-directed critical and contextual research themes in relation to personal interests and practice.
- 3 Defend personal studio practice in relation to a wide range of themes and cultural contexts using appropriate IT/retrieval methods.
- 4 Demonstrate appropriate use of academic resources

Indicative Module Content

The module will further formulate theoretical skills essential to underpin the individual student's developing personal interests and photographic practice. The module is aimed at contrasting critical theory and contextual themes. Students will continue to interpret diverse concepts around photography, lens-based moving image, cultural forms and processes. Students will use appropriate systems to research and submit work. Further methods of visualisation, documentation, research, critical analysis, referencing and academic writing will be discussed. Completed theoretical project work should support an awareness of sustainable themes in a photographic context.

Module Delivery

The module is lecture, tutorial and seminar based. Due to the individual nature of the themes, students will work in a self-directed manner. Tutorial support will be available and guidance will form an important part of this module.
