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Aims of Module

To allow students who select this option to supplement their academic studies and gain valuable additional experience through a 1 year paid placement with a suitable external employer.

Mode of Delivery

Placements will be co-ordinated and approved by the Industrial Training Tutor who will ensure that experience and training appropriate to the student's course of study is provided. During the placement students will be allocated a supervisor from the employing organisation who will be responsible for the day to day work

Learning Outcomes for Module

On completion of this module, students are expected to be able to:

- 1.Appreciate the demands and constraints placed on graduates in employment.
- 2.Apply science knowledge and skills to accomplish assigned tasks and communicate effectively with colleagues.
- 3.Demonstrate a mature and positive attitude to the world of work.

Indicative Module Content

Placement activities will be carried out in the employer's premises, the employment period being at least 9 months. During the placement the student will be regarded as an employee of the placement organisation and subject to the normal conditions of employment. A range of tasks may be carried out by the student as previously agreed between the employer and the Industrial Training Tutor.
