Aims of Module

To introduce the basic tools of information enquiry about politics and to enable students to focus upon contemporary issues in politics as they arise. The module will aid students in the development of initial competence and skills in politics-oriented information enquiry, and offer students opportunities for engagement in current affairs issues.

Learning Outcomes for Module

On completion of this module, students are expected to be able to:

- 1 Apply insights drawn from political science to the study of current issues in politics.
- Demonstrate competence in the use of a range of information sources to acquire information on current affairs.
- Demonstrate skill in the use of some of the basic tools of analysing public affairs, and to apply the concepts in basic form.

Indicative Module Content

An introduction to the methods and techniques that are used in the research and study of political issues. How to engage in the research of political issues. The selection of current affairs issues by negotiation with students. Help and advice to students as they conduct practical research on issues. Help with analysing and writing up research findings.

Module Delivery

This is a lecture-based course. It is supplemented by seminars in which students will be engaged in debates around contemporary political issues, and in which students will be asked to make class presentations.
