- 3 Logically develop appropriate professional research and data gathering skills to undertake engagement with the project's key stakeholders.
- 4 Critically evaluate, present and discuss the results of the research in an appropriate and professional manner.
- 5 Critically reflect on the learning and development from the relevant theories, concepts and debates evolving from the work-based activities executed during the student's final year of study.

Indicative Module Content

Identification of a problem or opportunity; negotiating scope of work and formulating a research proposal plan; selection of a suitable research design; consideration of research ethics; data collection and analysis; consideration of sustainability goals such as UNSDGs; preparing and presenting findings and output; preparing proposals and recommendations; written management report.

Module Delivery

Self-directed study, learning and research, guidance on the skills required to complete the task and supported by an academic supervisor.
