Aims of Module

To enable students to obtain knowledge and understanding of: (A) dispute resolution processes in the construction industry and the background to the introduction of statutory adjudication; (B) the role of statutory adjudication in the construction context under the Housing Grants, Construction and Regeneration Act 1996 (and secondary legislation); (C) the relationship between statutory adjudication and the employer?s payment obligation under a construction contract; (D) the nature of statutory adjudication as a compromise between expert determination and conventional arbitration; and (E) contractual adjudication.

Learning Outcomes for Module

On completion of this module, students are expected to be able to:

- Justify the role of statutory adjudication in construction under the Housing Grants, Construction and Regeneration Act 1996 (and secondary legislation).
- 2 Evaluate and discuss the nature of statutory adjudication as a compromise between expert determination and conventional arbitration.
- 3 Evaluate and discuss the nature of contractual adjudication.
