Aims of Module

To develop a professional understanding of the principles and applications of health and safety policy and risk management in an organisational context.

Learning Outcomes for Module

On completion of this module, students are expected to be able to:

- 1 Critically analyse the way in which health and safety policy impacts upon the organisation and its structure.
- 2 Investigate and discuss the range of approaches and models used in health and safety risk management.
- 3 Discuss the common law health and safety rules which protect employees.
- 4 Critically assess the development of the statutory rules relating to health and safety.

Indicative Module Content

This module provides students with an understanding of common law rules, duty of care, vicarious liability, history and sources of statute law in the UK governing health and safety; Health and Safety at Work Act 1974; European Health and Safety Law; Framework Directive. Additionally the module will evaluate the organisational elements of risk management in relation to health and safety; the implications for the organisation in relation to structure, policies and procedures.

Module Delivery

This module will be delivered using a variety of methods, focusing primarily on student-centred learning. This will include lectures, seminars, tutorials and workshops, with a strong emphasis on student participation. As students are online, they will achieve this through access to a range of materials to facilitate their learning, including topic guides, presentations and tutorials, plus exercises, groupwork and discussions.
