Aims of Module

To provide the student with an opportunity to evidence their developing employability skills and critically reflect on the impact of their placement year on their own progress and future employability.

Learning Outcomes for Module

On completion of this module, students are expected to be able to:

- Demonstrate using appropriate e-portfolio software the application of knowledge and understanding from previous academic study to the placement or study abroad.
- Convey an understanding of the industrial, research or academic organisation in which they are placed and reflect on the contribution made to that organisation.
- Demonstrate the progression of skills and experiences that they have acquired during the placement or study abroad and understand the now greater contribution they can make to the field of computer science.
- Critically evaluate their own strengths and weaknesses as computer scientists or software developers and how this has informed their intended future career path

Indicative Module Content

This module runs in conjunction with either CM4300, CM4301, CM4302 and is intended as a vehicle for students to evidence how their placement has helped them develop both academically and professionally. Content will be provided through an online learning environment with examples of e-portfolio use, personal development planning, aspects of reflective writing, and viva examination techniques.

Description:

Throughout the placement, the e-portfolio will enable the student to identify gaps in their own skills and knowledge and to critically evaluate their own strength and weaknesses. Setting their own objectives and subsequently demonstrating the ability to either meet or plan to meet these objectives is an important aspect of this module. The module will be assessed through an evaluation of the student's e-portfolio and a viva voce like interview about the stage 4 experience.
