On completion of this module, students are expected to be able to:

2. Recognise their own strengths and weaknesses as a potential systems/ network manager or consultant.
3. Apply the theories, models, concepts and principles acquired in the course programme to the workplace.

Indicative Module Content

The content of the work placement will vary. However, each student will draw up an agreed learning contract with the host organisation and devise a programme which will enable the learning outcomes specified to be achieved.

Component one is assessed by means of staff appraisal by the company following the approved University assessment scheme for this element. The scheme for assessment is designed to assess the learning outcomes 1-3 and consists of each student providing a portfolio of evidence which will contain the following:

- (a) a learning contract
- (b) documentation for the periodic reviews
- (c) a detailed log book
- (d) further evidence deemed appropriate by the student to demonstrate that the teaching outcomes set have been achieved. (100% weighting).
