Aims of Module

To enable students to apply a patient centred management approach and demonstrate professional values to all service users.

Learning Outcomes for Module

On completion of this module, students are expected to be able to:

- Assess service users to determine their needs; plan, apply, explain and modify treatment; and consistently demonstrate safe practice.
- Discuss and reflect on clinical reasoning in relation to assessment findings and response to treatment, relate clinical reasoning to the underlying pathology, and record all appropriately.
- Communicate effectively with service users, carers, clinical educator and appropriate members of the interprofessional team, understand own role and that of others within the team, demonstrating prioritisation of own workload.
- Explain service users health improvement needs, explain and implement strategies using an enabling approach with appropriate goals.
- Demonstrate the values and attitudes required of a physiotherapist, displaying professionalism at all times, and indentify and discuss own professional development requirements.

Indicative Module Content

This clinical practice based module will include experiential learning. Professional: Application of safe practice including mandatory training and protocols. Professional practice, standards, policies and procedures. Care, compassion respect and empathy. Team working, time management, administrative duties, organisation. Clinical skills: Assessment, treatment and management of service users. Clinical reasoning, problem solving, enablement and goal setting. Use of relevant professional documentation. Transferring knowledge and skills from academic modules and the available evidence base to support practice. Communication with service users, educators, tutors, interdisciplinary team members, support staff and other relevant parties. Personal Development: Reflection, personal and professional development and learning styles, contracts and opportunities.

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Module Delivery

This is a work based practice module in a physiotherapy practice setting. Each student will undertake 30 hours per week in the placement for a period of 5 weeks. This will equate to 150 contact hours. Students will also be expected to undertake directed study (identified reading) and private study according to individual need.
