Guidance will be sought from research, professional and healthcare policy, journals, national reports, professional publications and national forums. The primary themes will include: Legislation, government and professional policy, Modernisation, workforce planning and redesign in service delivery, Governance, standard setting and regulation of the allied health professions, The user perspective and patient centredness, Concepts and application of extended scope and advanced practice working, Leadership and interdisciplinary working, Impact of developing technology in imaging, Health and social care economics, financial management.
