The principles and concepts of total quality management will be examined with emphasis on methodologies for implementing continuous improvement. A particular focus is placed on the development of critical awareness of quality improvement principles, approaches and applications to service delivery. To these will be added process and system tools and techniques required in achieving continuous quality improvement.
