Development of Lex Maritima and the Law of the Sea (1982 UNCLOS); Maritime Security, Piracy; Hamburg Rules, Rotterdam Rules; Dry Shipping (Bills of Lading, Charterparties); Wet Shipping (Salvage, Towage, Ports and Harbours); Seafarers; Maritime Organisations (IMO, ILO, IMCO, BIMCO); Limitation of Liability; Marine Insurance; International Trade Law

The module will be delivered in both distance learning format and on campus. Thus it will be delivered by seminar teaching in class and alternatively by online supervised and interactive session using moodle. Problem excercises are to be posted and responded to by participants as part of the wider learning experience.
