## **ADDITIONAL NOTES**

This is a paramedic practice learning module carried out over 20 weeks at 37.5 hours a week. For stage progression a minimum of 50% attendance for ambulance and non ambulance to progress to the next stage. To pass stage two and module NU2404 the following minimum attainment is required: at least 80% of the relevant SOPS and 80% of the skills at the Minimal Supervision Level; a pass grade in final PLE; and 100% of the Standards of conduct, performance and ethics.
