- 4 Apply understanding of a range of clinical and therapeutic skills to inform therapeutic intervention in adult nursing.

Common physical and mental health problems - from: cardiovascular, endocrine, genetic, immune, infection, gastrointestinal, haematological, hepatic, musculoskeletal, neurologic, oncological, renal, respiratory, special senses, mental health - anxiety, addiction and substance misuse; Diagnostics, tests and their meaning; Suction; Wound management; Male and female Urinary Catheterisation; Assessment of those at risk of deterioration; Pain management relevant to adult nursing practices; Partnership working and the promotion of self care with people with acute and long term conditions; Main drug groups; Learning disabilities; Dementia.
