- 3 The student demonstrates the ability to work autonomously in applying relevant theories and principles in more complex care scenarios.
- 4 The student applies professional values, communication skills and principles of leadership, management and decision in a range of placement environments.

Indicative Module Content

The NMC 34 generic and 17 field specific standards of competency for entry to the professional register. These sit within the domains of Professional values, Communication and interpersonal skills, Nursing practice and decision-making and Leadership, management and team working. The NMC defined essential skills which sit within 5 clusters; care compassion and communication, organisational aspects of care, infection prevention and control, nutrition and fluid management, medicines management. Medicines management includes the administration of medicines and a range of numerical skills to be demonstrated in practice. Children and Young People's Nursing Practice.

ADDITIONAL NOTES

This is a nursing practice module. Practice learning is carried out by BN students in a practice placement environment at 37.5 hours per week over 12 weeks (450 hours). In order to be graded and achieve sign-off, the student must achieve a minimum of 300 hours in the practice placement. In addition, within practice learning the named mentor or another suitably qualified professional will sign off essential skills and competencies which must all be achieved by end of each practice module in stages 1 and 2. In stage 3, students should aim to achieve all essential skills cluster (ESC) competencies in each stage 3 practice module but as a minimum should achieve 80% in each practice module. Each ESC competency must be achieved at least once during stage 3.
