Indicative Module Content

Leadership theories; Leadership styles; Power; Team Working; Empowerment; Decision Making; Partnership Working; Multi-professional Teams; Change management; Motivation; Policy; Governance; Global context of health; Negotiation; Self-awareness; Emotional Intelligence; Resilience; Critical reflection of self and others; Personal Development Plan. This module aligns with United Nations Sustainable Development Goals 4, 5 and 10. It engages the student in understanding how good leadership can influence health, education and work.

Module Delivery

The module is delivered online via Moodle e.g. virtual classroom, discussion forums and self-directed study. For the MSc Nursing, the module will be delivered face-to-face on campus supported by online delivery.
