Evidence based practice, critical appraisal skills, use of patient data including physical examination, physiological, biochemical and haematological parameters. Accurate and effective communication. Building and maintaining effective relationships, shared decision making, team working. Factors influencing prescribing decisions including patients' characteristics. Legal, regulatory and professional frameworks for pharmacists which might underpin pharmacist prescribing in the local/national context. Pharmacy service provision. Planning and development of a pharmacist-led service.
