### Indicative Module Content

Understanding psychology, physical, sensory and perceptual development, social and personality development, cognitive development, learning theory, conditioning, schematic learning, moral reasoning, childhood, adolescence and adulthood. The module aims to provide students with a knowledge and understanding of psychological concepts and theories through exploring issues of childhood, adolescence, families, communities and society. The specific child-centred components of the module reflect the knowledge requirements within Key Capabilities in Child Care and Child Protection (Scottish Executive, 2006). The module is delivered and underpinned by a commitment to core social work values of respect, individualisation, empowerment, anti-discriminatory and anti-oppressive principles and uphold the values and ethical practice standards of Key Capabilities.
