Holistic assessment; pregnancy related complications; perinatal mental health; late, preterm and small baby; pregnancy loss; infant feeding challenges; neonatal jaundice; social vulnerability, inclusion and exclusion; learning disabilities; equalities and inequalities; racism and unconscious bias in maternity care; LGBTI in maternity care; induction of labour; woman centred care; physiological breech birth; medicine management; introduction to continuous fetal monitoring; introduction to emergencies in pregnancy and childbirth; introduction to neonatal resus; introduction to perineal repair; gender inequality; reduced inequalities. This module aligns with United Nations Sustainable Development goals 5 and 10.
