- Demonstrate evidence informed midwifery skills in the management of care for women and infants with additional care needs, escalating when required.

Woman centred care; sensitive care; public health; perinatal mental health; trauma informed care; social vulnerability, inclusion and exclusion; learning disabilities; equalities and inequalities; racism and unconscious bias in maternity care; LGBTI in maternity care; pre-existing medical conditions; common pregnancy complications; infant feeding challenges; continuous fetal monitoring; emergencies in pregnancy and childbirth; medicines management; infection and sepsis; perineal repair; neonatal resuscitation; pregnancy loss and end of life care; family integrated care; clinical decision making; collaborative team working; evidence based practice; clinical skills; gender inequality; reduced inequalities. This module aligns with United Nations Sustainable Development goals 5 and 10.
